TITLE: Sudanese Street Children's Program Report

OVERVIEW:

Decades of war in Sudan have left thousands of children living on the streets and many more growing up in harsh conditions in desert camps for internally displaced people. Operation Mercy Sudan, based in the capital of Khartoum, meets the immediate physical needs of these children while helping them build a brighter future. This project supports a drop-in center for hundreds of homeless boys.

We have 150 street children at the three Live in Centres.

The children on the streets live a terrible existence. They are constantly searching and begging for food. Children can often be seen searching through rubbish bins, skips and tips for scraps of food or something they can sell to buy food. Their life is a fight for survival at every corner. Often children die from sickness on the streets, with no one to care for them. In addition children are often taken into prison or military camps where they have a very difficult time. They are beaten by other street kids, the police or other adults whilst they live on the streets. They have no opportunity to get out of their situation. They become addicts in order to forget their suffering.

We have 50 children living in one of our Live in Centres, in Geraf; And 61 children living in the Live in Centres, in Omdurman We have 39 children living in the Renk live in centre. These boys are doing very well at the centres. They go to school every day and the older ones also have vocational training. They visit relatives regularly to build relationships with them. One boy has no relatives because his mother was a street girl who died and no one knows whom she belonged to. Another boy's mother is mentally disturbed and we don't know who her family is.

We also have 87 boys/ young men who have been returned to the community over some years, the majority to families. These boys are doing very well. They were sent back to the community after some years of rehabilitation and education in the live in centres.
