## Shallow investigations (Alexander)

- We have 5 currently going. Nuclear Proliferation has gone best so far and is the only one that's done.
- The limiting factor is waiting for experts to respond.
- We have added two more: Technology in Education and Family Planning in the Developing World.
- We hope to have five of the seven done by the end of July

# Medium depth investigations (Alexander)

- 1. Metaresearch
  - a. Open Science prong is done; Holden is going to write it up.
  - b. The "John Ioannidis prong" had led to new project, but our end of it is wrapped up
  - c. Evidence-Based Medicine prong is on hold until a conference this fall.
  - d. Thus Metaresearch is the first medium-depth investigation to be wrapped up.
- 2. Labor Mobility
  - a. This is about international immigration
  - b. Alexander is starting it now, in part because the shallows move slowly as we wait for people to respond
- 3. Geoengineering: Looking for a consultant.
- 4. Malaria: Elie is working on this and didn't give an update.

# **Politics (Holden)**

• We decided to talk to think tanks to understand the state of play of various issues better, since they appear to be part-way between academia and politics.

# Service Delivery Indicators Program (Tim)

Good Ventures, with input from GiveWell, is considering co-funding the Service Delivery Indicators Program (SDI) with the World Bank, Hewlett Foundation, and other SDI funders.

# **Donor relations (Elie)**

- Money moved is a major way we measure our success.
- Our donor retention rate is lower than is typical for non-profits receiving contributions. Our understanding is that a reasonable benchmark is ~80% of their \$1,000+ donors return the following year, whereas ours is 55%. We have a 49% return rate for all donors.
- Natalie is implementing changes to donor processing that should help somewhat.
- We also spoke with a board member about other things we could do to improve our donor relations.
- One challenge we face is that many of our users give directly to our top charities, which sometimes reduces our ability to easily and directly contact them.
