Craig Kaplan, Chief Financial Officer

Craig Kaplan graduated from the University of Massachusetts in Amherst, Massachusetts in 1977 with a Bachelor's of Business Administration. In 1986, he received a Master of Science in Computer Information Systems from Bentley College in Waltham, Massachusetts. While working for several regional public accounting firms, Craig obtained his license as a Certified Public Accountant. In 1984, he joined the international manufacturer BASF Corporation as a Senior Financial Analyst. In 1987, he was appointed the Financial Controller of the Boston Symphony Orchestra. During his 15-year tenure at the Orchestra, he managed the fiscal operations and reengineered the major business processes during a period of dramatic growth, whereby the annual operating budget expanded threefold to \$70 million, and the endowment fund grew from \$60 million to \$230 million. Craig joined PIH in 2002.

Joia Mukherjee, Medical Director

Joia Mukherjee is a global leader in the treatment of TB and HIV/AIDS in resource-poor communities. She divides her time between Brigham and Women's Hospital and clinical sites in Peru, Haiti, Rwanda, and Russia. Her work in Peru and Russia has led to the development of a new standard of care for the delivery of MDR TB treatment in resource-poor settings, and she serves as a consultant to tuberculosis projects throughout the world seeking to include the treatment of MDR TB to their existing programs. In rural Haiti, Joia's clinical work with HIV patients has involved establishing, in collaboration with local medical staff, a program to treat patients with symptomatic HIV infection with HAART. She is currently leading the PIH team to establish two demonstration HIV/AIDS treatment programs in Rwanda. Board-certified in Pediatrics, Infectious Diseases, and Internal Medicine, Joia also serves as an Attending Physician for the adult and pediatric infectious disease services at BWH, and the Massachusetts General Hospital, respectively. She holds the position of Associate Physician at the Division of Social Medicine and Health Inequalities at Brigham and Women's Hospital. Joia received her M.D. from University of Minnesota in 1992 and her MPH Harvard University in 2001.

Paul Zintl, Chief Operating Officer

Prior to joining PIH/PIDSC in 2002, Paul was a managing director of J.P. Morgan & Co. in New York, where he worked for 18 years, until 1995. In this capacity, his responsibilities included management, control, analysis, and evaluation of the firm's trading businesses. After leaving J.P.
